Diplomate Acupuncture (D.Ac.) Certification Training

The Kaminsky Group, LLC, The American Manual Medicine Association (AMMA) and the state chapter, Michigan Medical Acupuncture Association (MMAA), are pleased to offer this invitation to attend training for the Diplomate Acupuncture Certification Training Program (D.Ac.)

Who should take this program?

The Diplomate Acupuncture Certification Training (D.Ac.) Program is designed for the degreed professional health care provider who desires to add acupuncture to his or her therapeutic regime as a treatment modality. The qualified individual must have completed a regionally accredited degree program in medicine, osteopathy or other allied health medical specialty in the U.S., or a similar program recognized by appropriate agencies within other respective countries.

What you will receive:

Upon completion of this 100 hour course the candidate will receive a certificate of completion for the Diplomate Acupuncture Program (D.Ac.) and transcripts reflecting the hours of training. Upon verification of requisite training, qualified professionals will then be eligible to take the National Board Certification Agency's, Diplomate Acupuncture Certification Exam, offered by the AMMA.

This 100 hour training program will qualify physicians and non-physicians to practice acupuncture under the current delegation and supervision rules that regulate the practice of acupuncture in the State of Michigan.

Program Curriculum and Outline:

Part I – Clean Needle Technique and Public Safety Protocols (12 hours)

This 1 weekend residency course focuses on the principles and practice of hygiene, infection control and clean needle technique. The Public Health Code will be reviewed, as related to acupuncture. In this lecture and hands-on weekend format, needle technique and protocols for the safe and effective applications of acupuncture will be presented.

Part II – Contemporary Medical Acupuncture Courses (48 hours)

These four (4) 12-hour weekend residency courses combine lecture and hands-on practical training. Didactic material will include the latest research from the fields of bio-medicine, bio-mechanics, orthopedics, neurology, immunology and endocrinology that demonstrate, in western medical terms, how acupuncture affects the human organism.

Part III – Acupuncture Distance Learning Course (40 hours)

Distance learning courses will guide the candidate through the applied clinical application of contemporary medical acupuncture practice. Included, is a comprehensive review and competency assessment of progress notes related to patient encounters. Participants are responsible for the submission of twenty such procedures for review and assessment.

NBCA Diplomate Acupuncture Certification Exam (AMMA)

Following successful completion of Parts I, II and III, the D.Ac. candidate is eligible to register for the Diplomate Acupuncture Exam. National Board Certification in Acupuncture (AMMA NBCA NCE) is offered to D.Ac. candidates through the AMMA.
