



## Contemporary Medical Acupuncture: Supervisor Program

The American Manual Medicine Association (AMMA) and the state chapter, Michigan Medical Acupuncture Association (MMAA), are pleased to offer this special invitation to physicians to become certified as Supervisors of Contemporary Medical Acupuncture.

### Who should take this program?

The Contemporary Medical Acupuncture: Supervisor Program is designed for medical and osteopathic physicians who elect to delegate acupuncture as a therapeutic modality. Qualified individuals must have completed a regionally accredited degree program in medicine or osteopathy in the U.S., or an equivalent program recognized by the appropriate agencies within the candidate's respective country. In addition, qualified candidates should be licensed in a state that permits the delegation and supervision of acupuncture procedures.

### What are the requirements?

The 25 hour Supervisor Program option encompasses the principles and practice of medical acupuncture, and the requirements for its supervision and delegation. Completion of 2 weekend residency courses fulfill the 25 hour credit requirements. These 2 weekend Supervisor residency courses may be obtained through participation in any 2, of the 6 Diplomate in Contemporary Medical Acupuncture, Part II courses (see D.Ac. Part II Courses).

### What you will receive:

Upon program completion, participants will be issued an administrative certificate recognizing their accomplishment relative to the supervision and delegation of acupuncture procedures. Transcripts reflecting the hours of training completed will be provided.

*This 25 hour training program will qualify physicians to practice and/or delegate acupuncture under the current delegation and supervision rules that regulate the practice of acupuncture in the State of Michigan.*

### Program Curriculum and Outline:

#### Contemporary Medical Acupuncture Courses (25 hours)

The 2 weekend Supervisor residency courses (12.5 hours each) will be selected by the candidate from any of the 6, Diplomate in Contemporary Medical Acupuncture, Part II courses. These courses combine lecture and hands-on practical training. Didactic material includes the latest research from the fields of bio-medicine, bio-mechanics, neurology, immunology and endocrinology that demonstrate, in western medical terms, how acupuncture affects the human organism.

Completion of the Contemporary Medical Acupuncture Supervisor program requires completion of 2 weekend residency courses (25 credit hours).

These 25 credit hours obtained through the Supervisor program may be applied toward the 120 hour credit requirements for Diplomate Acupuncture (D.Ac.) Certification.
